Sub: - **JTO Phase-I training - unethical practice of the CGM, ALLTC, Ghaziabad – soliciting your urgent intervention - req.**

Ref: - **Our letter no.BSNLEU/523(TRG) dated 09.06.2020.**

With reference to the discussion that I had with you this morning, I once again bring the following to your kind notice, for favour of necessary intervention please.

It has been brought to our notice that the CGM, ALLTC, through informal communication, is pressurising the DR JEs who are awaiting JTO Phase-I training, to give their willingness / unwillingness to join the JTO Phase-I training starting at ALLTC, w.e.f. 06.07.2020. I wish to place on record the strong protest of our Union, to this unethical practice of the CGM, ALLTC. He is not expected to maintain any type of unofficial communication with the DR JEs awaiting training. I request you to kindly intervene in this matter urgently and to issue necessary instruction to the CGM, ALLTC.

It is needless for me to state that 2,000 people have died in India, due to COVID-19, during the last 24 hours. When the dreaded disease is spreading so alarmingly, what is the urgency for the CGM, ALLTC, to commence the JTO Phase-I training on 06.07.2020 itself, and that too in a centralised manner at ALLTC, Ghaziabad. By commencing the JTO Phase-I training so hastily, the CGM, ALLTC, is compelling the 116 JTO phase-I candidates to travel thousands of kilometers and thereby putting them to the risk of getting infected with COVID-19. This action of the CGM, ALLTC, is reckless and deplorable.

In this connection, BSNLEU wishes to place the following demands before your goodself, to safeguard the future of the 116 JTO phase-I candidates.

- (a) The JTO Phase-I training to the remaining 116 candidates (other than the 38 candidates who are already held up in ALLTC) should not be started hastily. The training may be started when the COVID-19 situation improves.
- (b) The candidates should not be compelled to travel thousands of kilometers, to join the training centre at Ghaziabad. Instead, the JTO Phase-I training of the remaining 116 candidates should be conducted in a decentralised manner. Their training should be organised in the nearest training centres, to their respective circles.

(c) The seniority of these 116 candidates should be protected vis-à-vis the 38 candidates, whose JTO Phase-I training has already started at ALTTC on 08.06.2020.

I once again urgently request you to kindly intervene in this matter and to ensure protection to the 116 DR JEs who are awaiting their JTO Phase-I training.
