Sub: - Requesting to ensure that the questions of JE LICE are not of high standard - req.

We wish to express our sincere thanks to you, for accepting the demand of our union, for holding the JE LICE as an offline exam.

Kindly recollect the discussion that we held with you on the subject, wherein we requested you to fix an early date for holding the JE LICE. We were informed that, the Management was trying to get an agency for organising the JE LICE. In this connection, we wish to suggest that, since it is already decided to hold the JE LICE as an offline exam, the same can be organised by the Management itself, instead of getting it done through an agency. By doing so, the Company can save a sizable amount of money also.

We wish to draw your kind attention to the discussions that took place in the 38<sup>th</sup> National Council meeting that was held on 29<sup>th</sup> April, 2019, on this subject. In that meeting, the Staff Side pointed out that, the questions asked in the JE LICE, held on 28.01.2018, were of very high standard, as a result of which many prospective candidates were not able to get through the exam. The Chairperson of the meeting was kind enough to agree to look into the contention of the Staff Side.

We also wish to bring to your kind notice that in the JE LICE held on 28.01.2018, out of the 1,800 candidates who appeared in the exam, for 9,185 vacancies, only 111 candidates got qualified. An important reason for the extremely poor results, was the high standard of the questions asked in the exam. For the forthcoming JE LICE also, the vacancies would be nearly 9,000, but the candidates would be less than 1,000 only.

In view of the foregoing, we earnestly urge upon you to kindly ensure that the questions to be asked in the forthcoming JE LICE, will not be of very high standard, so that maximum number of candidates can become JEs.

We request you to kindly consider our demand, taking into consideration, the age profile of the candidates who will be appearing the forthcoming exam.
